
Writing Effective Literature Reviews

Annotation:

This three-hour workshop is designed to help academics and Ph.D. students, especially non-native English speakers, on how to write an effective academic literature review.

We will focus on:

- the best approach to writing a review
- specific language commonly used
- ways to avoid plagiarism
- other elements of good academic writing style

This three-hour seminar (2 x 90 minutes with a 15 minutes break between) is designed for academics and PhD students, especially non-native English speakers. The programme will be run as closed online seminar in the platform ZOOM.
